### Jean-Paul DeCruyenaere

Dr. Jean-Paul DeCruyenaere obtained a B.Sc degree from the University of Manitoba in 1987, and Masters and PhD degrees from Carleton University in 1993 and 2000, respectively, all in Electrical Engineering. He was with the Defence Research Establishment Suffield from 1987 to 1991, the National Research Council in 1992-93, Nortel from 1993 to 1995, and the Communications Research Centre from 1997 to 2000. His PhD thesis was on radio coverage in broadband wireless access systems. He is currently with Maplebrook Consulting Inc. He is a Member of IEEE.

### David Falconer

Prof. David D. Falconer received the B.A. Sc. degree in Engineering Physics from the University of Toronto in 1962 and the S.M. and Ph.D. degrees in Electrical Engineering from M.I.T. in 1963 and 1967 respectively. After a year as a postdoctoral fellow at the Royal Institute of Technology, Stockholm, Sweden he was with Bell Laboratories, Holmdel, New Jersey from 1967 to 1980. During 1976-77 he was a visiting professor at Linköping University, Linköping, Sweden. Since 1980 he has been at Carleton University, Ottawa, Canada where he is a Professor in the Department of Systems and Computer Engineering. Since 1990, he has been active in a research project on broadband wireless communication at EHF radio frequencies, involving several universities, sponsored by CITR (Canadian Institute for Telecommunications Research). From 1990 to 1998 he led the project. He is a Fellow of IEEE.
