Edward M. Davison works for the Department of Commerce's National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA), Office of Spectrum Management (OSM). NTIA serves as the President's principal advisor on telecommunications policies and is responsible for managing the Federal Government's use of the radio frequency spectrum. He is the Manager of OSM's Satellite Coordination and Policy Program, which is responsible for the telecommunication needs of the Government satellite community, including the Department of Defense, NASA, Department of Commerce, and Department of Energy.

He has served as a delegate to many international meetings, including the 1992, 1995, and 1997 International Telecommunication Union's (ITU) World Radiocommunication Conferences. Issues in which he has been involved include the rewrite of the regulatory and procedural portions of the ITU's Radio Regulations, and allocations to Big LEOs, non-geostationary fixed-satellite service (NGSO FSS), and sharing between NGSO FSS and GSO FSS. He serves as Chairman of the Government's Space Systems Group, which is responsible for coordination between Government and foreign satellite systems under the provisions of the ITU Radio Regulations. In this capacity he has served on or has been head of delegations concerning the coordination satellite networks with other administrations, including Belgium, Italy, Japan, Russia, Spain, UK, and USSR.

He works in close coordination with the Federal Government agencies, the Federal Communications Commission, and the private sector to provide policy and technical leadership for the existing and future requirements of the satellite community. Coordination among Government satellite networks and with non-Government telecommunications systems is a primary responsibility.

Mr. Davison is a graduate of the University of Maryland, College Park, where he received a dual B.S. in electrical engineering and mathematics in 1980.

He is married with one son and has two Jack Russell terriers, Jackee and Andee.
