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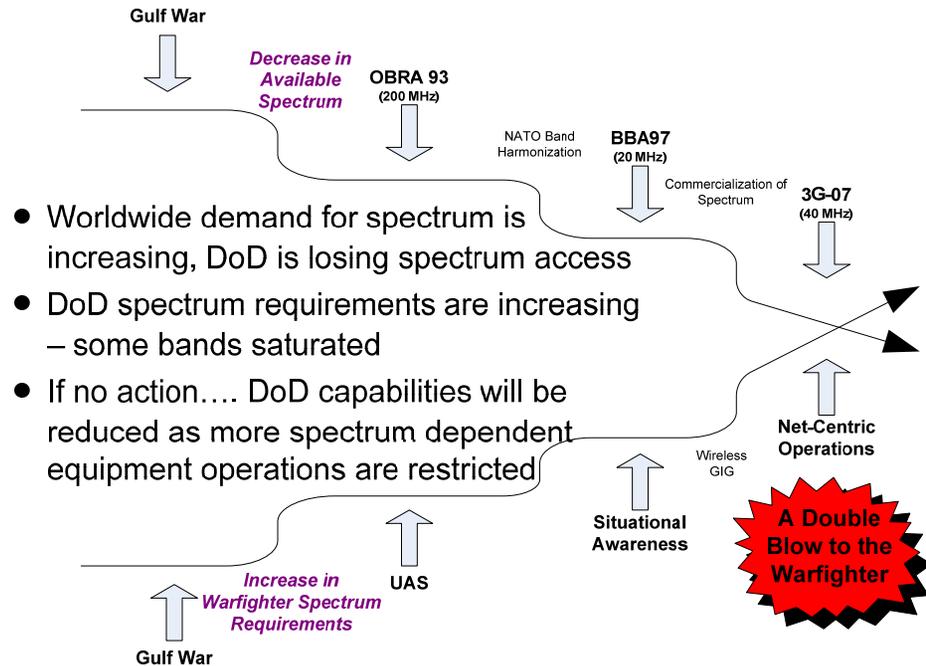


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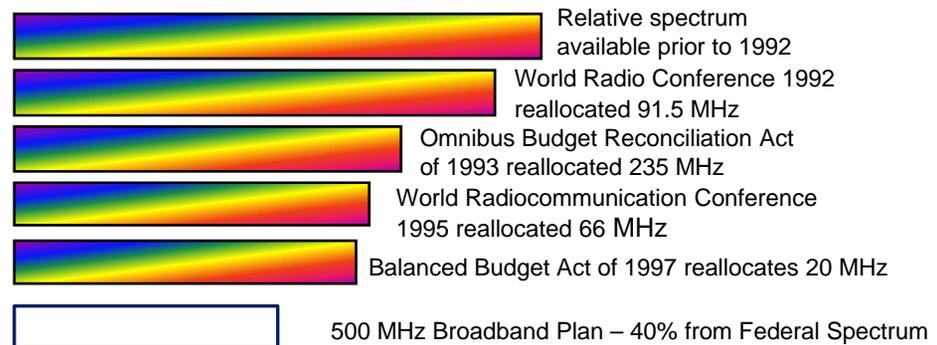
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Spectrum Availability Trends

- **Houston, We Have a Problem !**
- **Spectrum is a key enabler for all DoD operations**
 - Pressure to open more spectrum to commercial sector is increasing
 - Spectrum is inherently limited
 - Technology can improve efficiency and utilization of this resource
- **Must find ways to support greater spectrum use density**

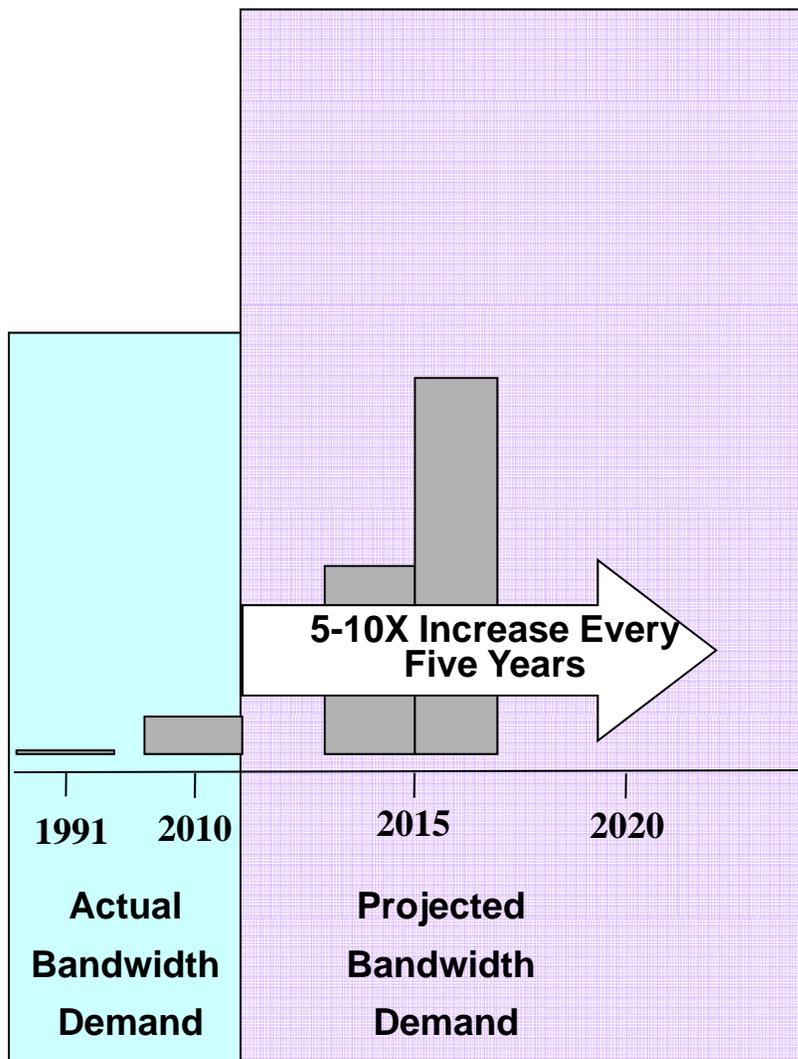


Cumulative Effect of Reallocation

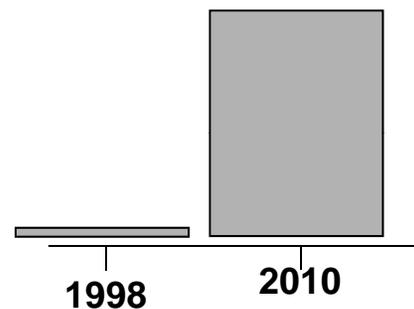


Since 1992, spectrum relocations have reduced DoD spectrum access 412.5 MHz

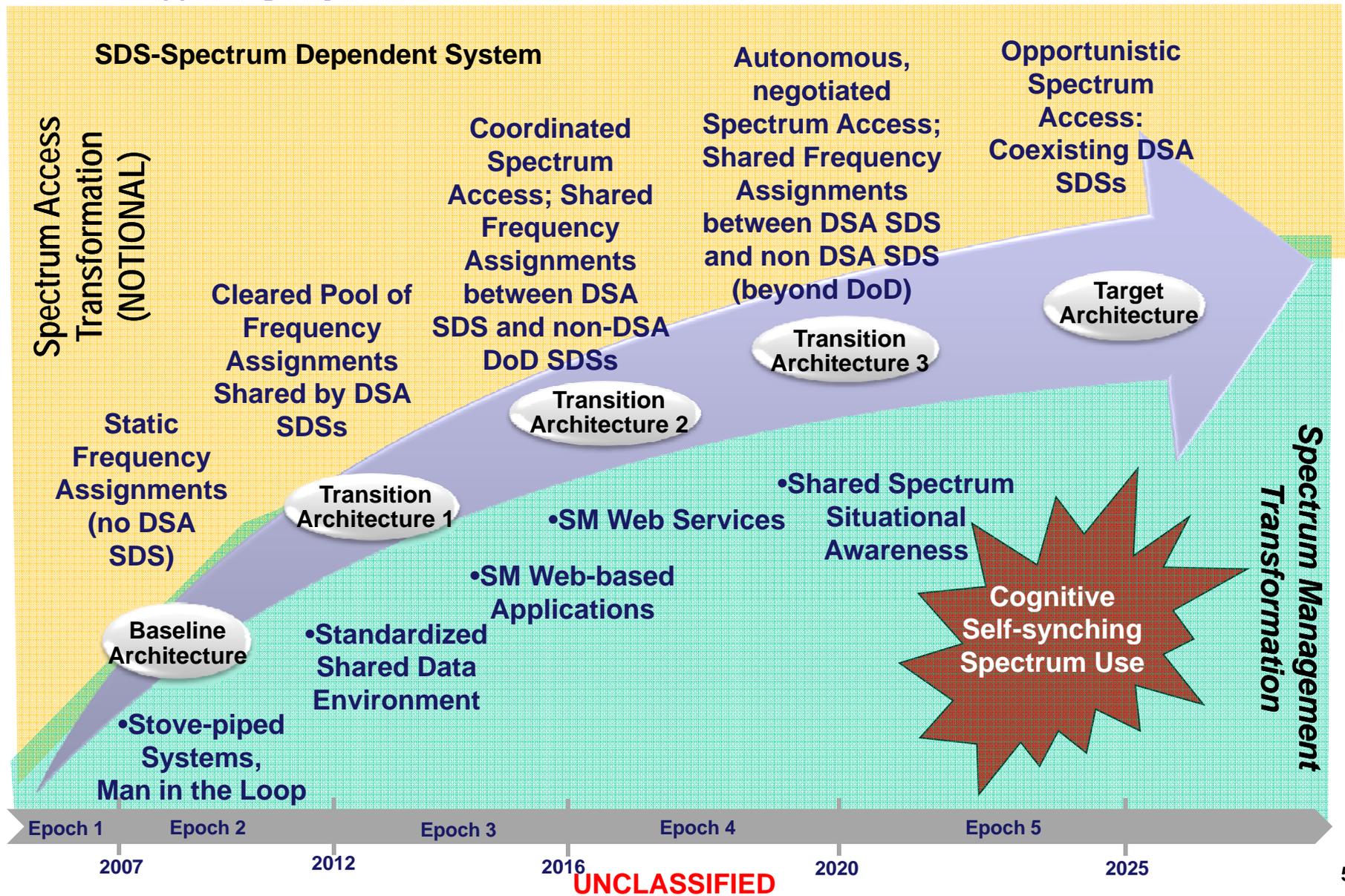
Growing DoD Spectrum Requirements

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Current Status

- **DoD shares spectrum everyday**
 - Among diverse systems both DoD and non-military systems
- **But we need and can do it better**
 - Higher fidelity engineering
 - Take advantage of processing power and predictive algorithms to identify and cancel interference
 - Make more use of the temporal aspect of spectrum use
- **Implement flexible technologies such as Dynamic Spectrum Access**

These steps are necessary just to meet DoD's own growing demands

We Will Share

- **Sharing spectrum is inevitable**
 - There just isn't enough in the lower portions of the EM spectrum to meet everyone's needs through exclusive allocations
 - There is a tremendous variance in how Nations use spectrum
- **We have (or will have) the technology**
 - We can design systems with advanced signal processing capabilities to identify and mitigate interference
 - We can build systems with policy based controls to adjust their behavior based on location/EME knowledge/sensing
 - Geographic sharing arrangements may be feasible

BUT;

How Do We Move Forward ?

- **DoD needs access to spectrum to test and train with new capabilities to ensure we are prepared**
 - We should establish one or more locations where DoD can have relatively free access to the EM spectrum
 - If we pursue geographic sharing, we need to establish a priority structure to adjust access during emergency situations
