Dr. Miller is a professional staff of the National Coordination Office (NCO) for Computing, Information, and Communications. He joined the NCO in April 1998 and has responsibility for coordinating multi-agency research activities in Large Scale Networking (LSN) including the Next Generation Internet Initiative and Scalable Information Infrastructure. Dr Miller coordinates the implementation teams of the LSN Working Group including the Joint Engineering Team, the High Performance Networking Applications Team, the Networking Research Team and the Internet Security Team.

Prior to joining the NCO, Dr. Miller supported the NASA Networking Research and Education Networking Program from 1994- 1998 with responsibility for networking for the Terra Mission Data and Information System. During this period he served as Secretariat of the international Committee on Earth Observing Satellites Networking Subgroup and as U.S. Secretariat of the Presidential Initiative Global Observation Information Networks (GOIN).

Dr Miller supported the State Department Undersecretary for Security Assistance with responsibility for coordinating international science cooperation programs, interagency development of the Chemical Weapons Treaty, and the development of U.S. Space Launch Policy.

Dr. Miller spent 20 years at the MITRE Corporation supporting the military development of data, information, and communications systems.

He obtained his BA from Swarthmore College in 1965 and his PhD in Chemical Physics from the University of Chicago in 1970.
